



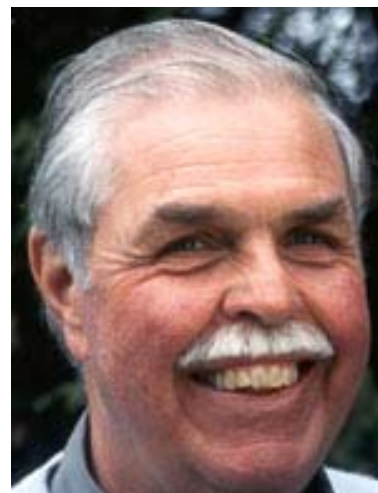

Adrian "Bud" Prince likes to take "all kinds of photographs" -- as long as they're unusual!" I will go almost anyplace -- from the top of a Myan pyramid to a mud wrestling event -- to capture a unique subject." He has traveled to China, Germany, Spain, Mexico, Japan, India, Sicily, Africa, Turkey, Greece, Thailand, Vietnam, Cambodia, and throughout the United States in his photo quest for unusual photographs.

Bud has over 300 different photographs accepted in International competitions and is a fellow in the Kodak Camera Club and the Third Dimension Society of England. He has won many photographic awards and is rated as a four star competitor in stereo, and a three star in photojournalism by The Photographic Society Of America. He operates his own photo art business and has judged many international competitions and has done a number of one-man shows.

His years of interest in Toastmasters International provide the background for teaching photography, lecturing throughout the United States and on photographic theme cruises, and working in radio and TV. He is currently a docent at The George Eastman House in Rochester New York and was a Kodak Ambassador. Bud received the Kodak Award for Excellence in Photography at the NFRCC conference in 2006.

The Rochester Institute of Technology awarded Bud a degree in Color Illustration and Commercial Photography, and he also has a degree from The University Of Rochester. He continues his strong interest in photographing many different kinds of subjects, and his work has appeared in numerous publications. Bud lives in Geneseo, New York. **F**

Some news from the last NFCC Executive meeting

1. The NFCC is seeking to purchase a digital projector for use in program presentations and in digital slide competition. Miriam Gersho applied to the Meridian Credit Union for a grant in their community grant program, but the application for the grant to the club was turned down. The executive is also seeking to get a loan from the Niagara Frontier Regional Camera Club at the November meeting.

2. In order to finance the purchase of a digital projector, it was suggested that the club make a calander for the year 2008 with prints from the members. Scott Simons will look into getting prices for the calendar.

3. A motion was put forward by Leslie Khan, seconded by Len Mather, to allow all members with the minimum award requirement to advance from the Gold level to the Diamond level. At present, only one member per year is allowed to advance to the Diamond level. The motion was defeated by a 5 to 7 vote. **F**



Niagara Frontier Regional Camera Clubs

At the last Regional Convention in March, concerns were raised about some of the slides/prints entered in the competitions. As a result, the Nature Guidelines Committee was formed to review the guidelines for these competitions. The revised guidelines are listed below. These guidelines (or an amended version) will be voted upon at the next Regional Board meeting in November.

The Nature Guidelines Committee recommended that the Peyton-Majumdar Trophy be presented in a unique competition at the next convention. The guidelines attached are only intended to be in effect for this competition. No suggestion came from the Nature Guidelines committee to change the other slide competitions at convention.

A new category for the NFRCC Convention Slide Salon

Wildlife/Nature

The winner of this competition category shall receive the **Diane Peyton-Majumdar Trophy**. Second and third place awards will also be given.

Slides entered into this category must feature animals.

They can represent:

1) Non-captive animals in their native habitat.

However, images in which a manmade object has become part of the creature's natural habitat, such as a stork in a roof nest or a barn swallow in its nest in a barn, as well as tagged animals in the wild, are acceptable.

2) Captive animals that are living in a natural environment.

These images must have been skillfully taken to avoid showing signs of the captivity. Game farms and zoos may sometimes provide such images.

Any image entered into this wildlife/nature category must be truthful (documentary) to the subject as seen. Significant objects cannot be added or removed.
